New Boston Food Waste Composting Program

The New Boston Food Waste Compost Program Service, in collaboration with Renewal Compost LLC, is providing a service to remove a valuable resource from the waste stream and turn it into a composted soil amendment. Food Waste will be collected at the facility and processed offsite. Removing food scraps from solid waste will lower the Transfer Station operating costs by reducing annual tonnage and trucking fees. Anything from your kitchen can be placed in the container at the Transfer Station. The cost to operate the program is less expensive than throwing the food scraps into the trash and dumped into a landfill.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation in making this outstanding food waste composting program an achievable Town of New Boston community effort.

The following list of materials that are acceptable and must be contamination free

- Coffee Grounds, coffee filters, tea bags (<u>No</u> K-cup pods)
- Paper plates paper towels, napkins
- Meat and Poultry, Fish (fat, skin and bones ok)
- Dairy products, Milk, Cheese, Yogurt
- Vegetables, fruits (peels and cores)
- Eggs, Egg shells, Paper Egg Cartons
- Nuts, shells, nut butters (peanut, hazel nut)
- Flowers
- Fur and Hair
- Pasta
- Bread
- Certified compostable packaging
- Rotted food and out-of-date food
- Lobster shells
- Flour, sugar or any baking goods
- Takeout leftovers
- If it comes from the Kitchen, Garden or Pantry it's Compostable!

Sorry, Not Compostable or Acceptable

- Non-compostable packaging
- Nonfood products
- No pet waste or kitty litter.
- Grease
- No Ashes from fireplace or grill
